In March, 1952 - when stereo photography was on everyone's mind - the Chicago Lighthouse for the Blind sponsored a "Snow Ball", an annul fund-raising event. A feature of the intermission was an invitational exhibition of 3-D photography. Well-known personalities, including actor Harold Lloyd and the drugstore chain's Myrtle Walgreen, were invited to exhibit. Many members of the Jackson Park Camera Club's 3-D section also exhibited.

The "Snow Ball" became the foundation stone of the Chicago Stereo Camera Club. A group of stereographers under the guidance of Robert L. McIntyre, Camera Editor of the Chicago Tribune, organized the club with hosting the Chicago Lighthouse International Exhibition of Stereo Photography as one of its primary purposes. The club joined the Photographic Society of America with the result that shows had to be conformed to meet PSA's rigid exhibition standards. Workshop parties were held often and club members attended not only to participate but to support, serve and cheer those who were doing the work. At public presentations, ladies of the club wore gowns and the gentlemen dressed accordingly, a sign of the lofty position the club held in Chicago society.

Today, the Chicago Lighthouse International Exhibition of Stereo photography is the world's oldest annual exhibition of stereo photography and Chicago Stereo Camera Club is proud to be listed as the longest continuing contributor to the Chicago Lighthouse.

Since 1906, the Chicago Lighthouse has been creating opportunities which enable people who are blind, visually impaired or blind with additional disabilities to assume their rightful place in society.

With a broad base of corporate, foundation and individual support, hopes become reality every day at the Lighthouse: a child takes a first step toward independence with a white cane; a senior citizen lives independently with special visual aids.

The Vocational Evaluation Center assists Chicago area people who are blind or visually impaired to assess their own abilities, interests and potential. Newly blinded adults may go to The Chicago Lighthouse to learn to adjust, obtain career guidance and learn new job skills. The Chicago Lighthouse teaches both office and industrial skills and their employment placement service continues to successfully set national records.

The Children's Development Center in The Chicago Lighthouse trains and nurtures children with handicaps so severe that they cannot attend regular schools. The Lighthouse is a national leader among agencies that create opportunities for people with visual impairments. As society, technology and the demands of the job market change, so do the initiatives and goals of the Lighthouse.

Entry fees and donations received at public showings of this salon have supplied some of the funds required for non-grant items essential to the operation of The Chicago Lighthouse. The Chicago Stereo Camera Club is proud to be the sponsor and contributor for the fifty-eighth consecutive year.


